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VERRASOL POST CARE

Verrasol is a chemical compound that is used to treat warts.

The post care directions are as followed:

- Once you leave our office you are to leave the Verrasol on for two hours.
- Use an alcohol pads or soap and water to gently wipe away the Verrasol.

The area may blister; the goal of the Verrasol is to irritate the skin to help get rid of the wart.

DO NOT attempt to break the blister- this can spread the virus.

24 HOURS AFTER VERRASOL:

After 24 hours, soak a soft cloth or gauze with Vinegar water (1 tablespoon white vinegar to 1 pint warm water).

Hold the cloth or gauze to the affected area for 5-10 minutes twice a day until healed. This will prevent infection and promote healing.

The following antibiotic ointment should be lightly placed on the area after soaking and a loose Band-aid applied. Follow these care instructions for 10-14 days, or until healed.

- Polysporin or
- Bacitracin

Showering: You may shower after 24 hours, unless otherwise directed. Leave the bandage in place to help prevent contaminated products from entering the healing area. After the shower, begin the vinegar water soaks/cleaning, pat dry, apply your antibiotic ointment, and cover with a fresh clean bandage.
